## Goal 1: Intermediate Housing Strategies in Motion

**Develop Intermediate Housing Supply for FEMA-Ineligible Survivors** 

#### **Statewide Target = 1,000 Homes**

- Acquisition of 200 RVs: OHCS-ODHS
   partnership to acquire the RVs and work
   with local partners to identify sites for
   placing RVs and other intermediate
   housing types
- Gateway Transitional to Permanent
   Housing site in Talent: currently under
   construction to provide 53 RV sites

**Provide Navigation, Rapid Re-housing, and Counseling for Permanent Homes** 

Statewide Target = All Survivors
Permanently Homed in 4 Years

- Housing Navigation and Rental
   Assistance: Disaster Case Management
   (DCM), Long Term Recovery Groups and
   Community Action Agencies
- Wildfire Recovery and Resilience Account:
   New program with flexible resources to support survivors on their path to recovery including landlord incentives

# Goal 1: Intermediate Housing Strategies in Motion

Provide "storefront" aid to survivors that accelerates their placement in permanent homes, or intermediate solutions where necessary, by rapidly expanding Regional Housing Centers' capacity and scope.

- ACCESS and partners in Jackson County: Center for Community Resilience will provide wrap around services to survivors
- OHCS and HUD: Rapid Re-housing, Technical Assistance, Housing Counseling
- Strong relationships with culturally specific partners

## Goal 3: Expedite Permanent Housing Strategies in Motion

Increase Pace and Scale of Rental Housing
Production: Position existing and ongoing OHCS
development resources to prioritize wildfire
recovery in competitive processes designed to
add to housing supply.

- 2021 NOFA: 72 new homes in Talent, 126 total in Mill City and Stayton
- New Local Innovation and Fast Track (LIFT) Rental Housing
