

A recreational marijuana retailer must verify the age of a person purchasing or acquiring marijuana items. A person must be 21 years of age to purchase marijuana for recreational purposes, or 18 years of age if acquiring marijuana as a registry identification cardholder.

Under Oregon Law only the following **non-digital, unexpired, and unaltered** forms of identification are acceptable alone as proof of age when purchasing or acquiring* marijuana items:

- 1. Driver license from a U.S. state, District of Columbia, or a province or territory of Canada.
- 2. ID card with photo, name, date of birth, and physical description issued by a U.S. state, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, United States Virgin Islands, or American Samoa, or a province or territory of Canada.
- 3. ID card issued by a federally recognized Indigenous American tribe with photo, name, physical description, and date of birth.
- 4. Passport or passport card.
- 5. U.S. military ID card.
- 6. NEXUS or SENTRI card.

* A marijuana retailer may require ID from a person in addition to what is listed above only if the ID is the person's registry identification card as defined in ORS 475B.791.

Only the identification listed above are acceptable alone as proof of age. Following are examples of identification that **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE ALONE** as proof of age:

- Green card
- FAST card
- Prison ID card
- Gun or Firearms permit, including a permit which allows the carrier to carry a weapon in public in a concealed manner
- IDNYC card (New York City Identification card)
- Social Security card
- Pilot's license
- Veteran Health Identification card
- Student ID cards
