Develop your intervention

Create Theory of Change and expand it into a Logic Model

Logic Model includes Outputs and (short-, medium-, and long-term) Outcomes

Measure what you value and value what you measure

What is Performance Measurement?



Performance Measurement Regulations: 45 CFR 2522.550-2522.650

Performance measures – measurable indicators of a program's performance as it relates to member service activities

Performance measurement – the process of regularly measuring the services provided by your program and the effect your program has in communities or in the lives of community beneficiaries

All grantees must establish, track, and assess performance measures for their programs

- Performance measure targets are entered in the application
- Performance measure actuals are reported in the End-of-Year Project Progress Report

Performance Measurement



Ongoing, systematic process of tracking your project outputs and outcomes

Outputs: Amount of service provided

Number of individuals, organizations, other entities served

Outcomes: Changes or benefits that occur

- Can be changes in individuals, organizations, communities, or the environment
- Typically include changes in knowledge, attitude, behavior, or condition

Outcomes have a logical connection to the service activities and be aligned with outputs

Purpose of Performance Measurement



Recognition of progress

 Collect reliable information about the intervention's implementation and progress toward outcomes

Accountability to funders and stakeholders

Communicate achievements in a meaningful and objective way

Program improvement

- Spot and correct problems
- Strengthen the intervention
- Determine where to allocate limited resources

How AmeriCorps Uses Performance Measures



Tell the story of the collective accomplishments of national service programs

National Performance Measures

- Provide shared language for outputs and outcomes that multiple programs have in common
- Cover all AmeriCorps focus areas

Applicant-Determined Measures

• Intended for programs whose interventions, outputs, or outcomes do not fit under existing National Performance Measures

AmeriCorps State and National Performance Measure Requirements



At least one aligned performance measure (output paired with outcome) connected to primary intervention

- Must focus on community impact
- May be National Performance Measure or applicant-determined measure
- Additional performance measures, including output-only National Performance Measures, are permitted but not required

Performance measures reflect significant activities in applicant's Theory of Change

No need to capture all program activity in performance measures

Use National Performance Measures and system-defined interventions if applicable

- Do not create applicant determined outputs or outcomes that duplicate existing NPMs
- Do not create user-defined intervention labels that duplicate existing interventions

PM Instructions - Requirements



AmeriCorps State and National Performance Measure Requirements

All applications must include at least one aligned performance measure (output paired with outcome) that corresponds to the proposed primary intervention. This may be a National Performance Measure or an applicant-determined measure depending on the program's theory of change. Applications may also include National Performance Measure outputs without associated outcome(s) provided that the output measures a significant program activity. These output-only measures do not fulfill the requirement for an aligned performance measure but may be selected in addition to the aligned measure(s).

All performance measures must reflect significant program activities whose outputs and outcomes are consistent with the applicant's core theory of change. Applicants are not expected to have performance measures for every program activity. AmeriCorps does not require applicants to use National Performance Measures but expects them to do so if National Performance Measures reflect key outputs and/or outcomes of the theory of change. Applicants may not create applicant determined outputs or outcomes that duplicate existing National Performance Measures.

All performance measures, including output-only measures, must be associated with one or more interventions (service activities). Applicants are expected to use the system-defined intervention categories if they appropriately represent the applicant's program activities. Applicants may not create user-defined intervention labels that duplicate existing intervention categories.

PM Instructions – Selection Rules

These selection rules specify allowable output/outcome pairings for National Performance Measures. Applicants must follow these selection rules when using National Performance Measures. Applicants may not select any National Performance Measures that may appear in eGrants if they are not present on this list. PM Instructions – Appendix A



Member Service Year (MSY) and Member Allocation

Entering information into the application's Performance Measure Module that shows the program's best estimate about how member time will be allocated

Allocate MSY and Members

- At the Objective level
 - All MSY must be allocated to one or more Objectives and cannot be counted more than once
 - Members must be allocated to one or more Objectives and may be counted more than once
- At the Performance Measure level
 - Since not all program activities need to be captured in Performance Measures, not all MSY and Members must be allocated to a Performance Measure

Total MSYs in the Budget must match MSYs allocated to the Objectives

Appendix C: Frequently Asked Questions

1. What should a continuation applicant do if one or more of their National Performance Measures is no longer present in the Performance Measure Instructions?

All applicants, including continuation applicants, must follow the National Performance Measure selection rules specified in the current Performance Measure Instructions. Applicants must revise their performance measures as needed to conform to the updated instructions.

2. What should a continuation grantee who is measuring a National Performance Measure output or outcome that has a changed definition do in the continuation application?

If the grantee is unable to measure the output or outcome as defined in the current Performance Measure Instructions, the grantee should choose a different performance measure.

3. What are National Performance Measures?

AmeriCorps has established six Focus Areas: Disaster Services, Economic Opportunity, Education, Environmental Stewardship, Healthy Futures, and Veterans and Military Families based on the priorities included in the Serve America Act. Within these Focus Areas, as well as for Capacity Building, AmeriCorps has created National Performance Measures in order to aggregate the results of similar programs and demonstrate the impact across our agency programs and initiatives.

Best Practices: Performance Measure Design



- Select performance measures that fit your program design and theory of change, not vice versa
- Read the instructions
- Less = more: limit performance measures to significant program activities
- Select measures that complement existing Performance Data Elements
- Use National Performance Measures when they fit the program design
- Use system-defined intervention categories when possible (but other interventions are allowable)

Best Practices: Performance Measure Design



- Clearly define terms and ensure they are meaningful
- Clearly distinguish outcomes from outputs while maintaining logical alignment
- Choose outcome measures that are ambitious but realistic
- For outcomes that require participant follow-up, set targets that take into account response rate attrition
- Use pre-post assessments when possible
- Use numerical targets, not percentages

Best Practices: Performance Measure Design



- Select data collection instruments that are valid (measure what they are supposed to measure) and yield consistent and accurate results
- Choose data collection instruments that are accessible and yield timely data
- Allocate sufficient resources toward data collection efforts: money, time, personnel, training, storage

Each AmeriCorps member will meet with different groups of 5-8 children after school each day for about 30 minutes each over a period of 8 months, using a nutrition education curriculum developed by a consortium of state and local public health agencies. Members will also recruit volunteers to help community centers expand health-focused physical activities in their afterschool programs.

The HealthyCorps Program is requesting six halftime AmeriCorps members to lead small-group health education programs for elementary students at area community centers. The primary short-term goal of the program is to improve children's understanding of healthy eating habits, with the longer-term goal of improved health during their teen years.

Step 5: Calculate MSY and Member Allocations



Determine how many members, and what portion of members' time (MSYs), will be devoted to:

- A) Each focus area and objective
- B) The specific activities captured by the performance measure*

Members can be counted toward more than one focus area/objective/activity; MSYs cannot

*Not all member activities need to be captured under performance measures

Step 6: Set Output and Outcome Targets



Ambitious but realistic estimate of what can be accomplished in 1 program year

Outcome targets should relate logically to output targets

HealthyCorps targets:

- Output H4A: 150 students
- Outcome H17: 90 students

 Sign-in sheets for each nutrition education session that capture each participant's first and last name. Data from sign-in sheets will be transferred to Excel spreadsheets to track each individual child and the number of times they attended sessions.

HealthyCorps outcome instrument:


 Pre-post test with 20 multiple-choice questions asking children to select the healthiest food choices. This assessment was developed by the public health agency consortium to align with their nutrition education curriculum, and has been previously tested in five states. Children will take the pre-test during the first session, and the post-test will be given after 8 months or when the child leaves the program, whichever is sooner.
